



To Apply For a **New** OR to **Renew** the HPD Honorably Retired Identification Card (Without handgun permits)

1. If you are applying for a **new** or to **renew** your HPD Honorably Retired Identification Card (**without handgun permits**), please complete the Houston Police Department Honorably Retired Identification Card Application & Affidavit (**must be notarized**) forms and mail to:

2. Employee Services Division will complete a background check and submit the application packet to the Office of the Chief of Police for approval. The process takes approximately 3-4 weeks and you will be contacted once you have been approved.
3. Please keep in mind, the Honorably Retired Identification Card expires every five years, therefore, applicants will need to complete the paperwork and have a photo taken every 5 years, in person at HPD.

Per Department policy, business attire is required for all photos, therefore, men should bring a coat and tie and women should bring a conservative shirt or dress for the photo.

4. You will also need to bring your expired Honorably Retired Identification Card. If your ID card was lost or stolen, please file a police offense report and complete the Affidavit for Replacement of Lost or Stolen ID Card (must be notarized) along with the HPD application.

- I am capable of exercising sound judgment with respect to the proper use and storage of a handgun.
- I understand that I must meet and follow all procedures established by the Houston Police Department in order to obtain the State and/or Federal Handgun Certifications.
- I understand that I am solely responsible for reviewing and complying with all local, State and Federal concealed handgun laws.
- I am not prohibited under any law from carrying a firearm.
- My license as a commissioned officer has never been revoked or suspended.
- I have not made any material misrepresentation or failed to disclose any material fact, in my request for certification as an honorably retired police officer.

I have fulfilled all the eligibility requirements listed under state law, Section 1701.357 of the Occupations Code, including:

- I have honorably retired after 10 years of service as a commissioned police officer with one or more state or local law enforcement agencies; **or (please initial only one)**
- I am a qualified retired law enforcement officer as defined by 18 USC § 926C.

I have fulfilled all the eligibility requirements listed under federal law, 18 USC section 926(c), as defined by the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 and the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act Improvements Act of 2010, including:

- I separated from service in good standing from the Houston Police Department and have either (i) at least 10 years of cumulative service as a commissioned law enforcement officer, or (ii) separated in good standing with a service-connected disability other than mental instability.

Frequently Asked Questions for HPD Honorably Retired ID Card

Q: Do I have to have the affidavit notarized prior to mailing for the HPD Honorably Retired Identification Card form?

A: For new and renewal applicants, please complete the application and have the affidavit signed and notarized prior to mailing. We do not accept affidavits that have not been signed and notarized.

You may also complete this application in person but you will not receive your new/renewed Retired I.D. card until the background check is complete (3-4 weeks).

Q: Where do I mail the forms for the HPD Honorably Retired Identification Card?

Q: How often do I need to take an ID photo and what should I wear for the photo?

A: A new photo is required every 5 years or when an updated photograph is necessary. All applicants are required to wear business attire; this includes a coat and tie for men and a conservative shirt or dress for women.

Q: I retired from HPD but am now working as a commissioned officer for another agency; can I get an Honorably Retired Identification Card?

A: If you are currently employed as a commissioned officer for another agency/company, you are eligible to receive and/or renew the Honorably Retired Identification Card.

Q: I can't find my old Retired ID Card, what do I need to do?

A: You will be required to file a police offense report and complete the Affidavit for Replacement of Lost or Stolen Retired ID Card (must be notarized) along with the HPD application.
